2014: Record Breaking Winter

With the snow storms just in January and February alone, a 130-year-old record was shattered. For the first time in the region's history, there have been four 6+ inch snowfalls or more in a season. In addition, we are now in the top 5 snowiest winters of all-time.

It was a very demanding winter for the entire region, and the storms with heavy wet snow were a particular challenge to municipal workers and residents alike who had to heft the heavy shovels of flakes. With 57 miles of roads to maintain, Towamencin Township Public Works crews worked around the clock on several occasions.

Different types of storms require the use of different snow-fighting techniques. The decision whether to salt or plow depends upon the expected weather conditions and is made with great consideration based on the latest weather information available.

Plowing under the wrong conditions can create a polished street surface, resulting in dangerous glare ice.

Road crews faced a dilemma as severe storms started advancing towards our community. Because of limited salt supplies in the region, if they plowed the snow off the roads, they would be leaving a layer of ice on the roads. The concern was if you give the impression that a road is clear but you have a layer of ice it's just going to increase the probability of some serious accidents.

One of the stressful issues this winter was the depleting supply of road salt in the region. At least three times, Towamencin had only enough salt left on site for one more

application of Township roads; other municipalities were in the same situation. Working with our supplier and other communities, the Township Public Works Director

was able to scavenge enough salt to safely meet each storm.

From time to time, a mailbox will be damaged by the Township's plow. Although Penn-DOT will not reimburse for mailboxes damaged on the State Roads that they plow, it has been Towamencin Township's policy that should a mailbox / post be damaged, the owner must report the damage to the Township within one week from the date of the snowstorm to be eligible for reimbursement.

The Township reimburses property owners up to a maximum of \$100 per incident on Township-owned Snow that is thrown from plows can damage mailboxes if they are not properly prepared and secured. Mailbox damage due to snow and not hit directly by the plow or truck is considered the homeowner's responsibility. This policy, which has been in place for at least ten years, was reaffirmed by the Towamencin Township Board of Supervisors in January 2012.

The winter of 2014 will long be remembered.

Tax and Sewer Information



For home and business owners, the 2014 Tax and Sewer/Septic bills were mailed out in February. The bill was marked with "2014 Tax and Sewer/Septic Bill". You should have received it in the mail. If you have not received it, please contact Township administration personnel at 215-368-5357 as soon as possible. If you don't receive a bill, or you fail to pay your bill and allow your payment to lapse, there is

no provision in current state law allowing the Board of Supervisors to waive penalties and fees -- they remain the responsibility of the homeowner.

Tax bills will not be mailed to mortgage companies; property owners should forward the bill to their mortgage company if their taxes are escrowed. However, sewer/septic bills are the responsibility of the property owner. Mortgage companies will not pay sewer/septic bills.

Any request for a change in mailing address must be submitted to the Township in writing. The Township does not change the property owner's name unless directed by the County.

Homestead Exemption Act

The Taxpayer Relief Act provides for property tax reduction through a "homestead exemption". Generally, most owner occupied homes are eligible for the property tax reduction.

In 2000, the County implemented the Homestead Exemption Program to give a tax break to certain property owners. In order to participate, the property must be the primary residence of the property owner. Commercial properties and rental properties do not qualify.

The Township annually, as a part of its budget process, determines the amount of exemption, currently it is \$59,000. Participating homeowners will receive an exemption on the Township portion of their tax bill. For 2014, it is a \$225 tax reduction. When looking at the tax bill, you will note a County assessed value and a Township assessed value. If the homeowner is participating, the difference in the two assessed values will be the Homestead Exemption for that year.

The forms are available at the Township building or online at www.montcopa.org/boa. The homeowner will receive notification from the County only if the property does not qualify for participation. Once a property is participating, it will remain in the program unless its status changes (i.e. sold or rented). A new buyer must register with the County in order to participate.

Storm Preparation

Are you prepared for the Spring and Summer storms and power outages that come with heavy rains and downed trees? Here are some things that you can do, at no cost, that will help you get through unexpected events:

- Put water in plastic containers, but do not completely fill the container (leave about an inch of space) and put them in your freezer. They can be used during an outage to preserve food and medicine requiring refrigeration.
- -Ensure you have fresh

batteries for your flashlights and portable radio.

- -If you have advance warning of an impending storm, charge all those devices you will need to be able to communicate outside your home.
- -Heed storm warnings and plan accordingly.
- -If you must use candles ensure they are not placed near flammable materials (curtains, combustibles, etc.) and extinguish them if you are going to be out of the room for an extended period of time.
- -Ensure power generators are not run in garages or enclosed areas where carbon monoxide may overcome you.
- -Treat all downed power lines as live and capable of electrocuting you.
- -Check on the elderly and make sure they are okay.

Turnpike Widening Project Update

The Pennsylvania Turnpike Commission (PTC) has been has advised that the Northeast Extension widening project is progressing towards our Township. Final design was completed on the northern section (Berks Road to the Lansdale Interchange,) in December 2013. The PTC selected a contractor for the northern section construction project in early 2014, with construction to begin in April.

The northern section construction project, which traverses Worcester, Upper Gwynedd, Towamencin, and Lower Salford Townships, will include the full-depth total reconstruction and widening of the existing four-lane roadway. The existing 12-foot travel lanes, with a limited left-lane shoul-

der and eight- to 10-foot right-lane shoulder will be reconstructed to accommodate six 12-foot travel lanes with 12-foot left and right shoulders.

Three overhead bridges (Kriebel Road, Morris Road, and Sumneytown Pike) have been replaced to accommodate the future six-lane Turnpike. The Bustard Road Bridge near the Towamencin Volunteer Fire Company main station will be closed from April through November and detoured during construction. The bridge will be rebuilt during the northern section construction phase, along with the Lansdale Interchange ramp. Traffic will be detoured over Sumneytown Pike, Forty Foot Road, and Rittenhouse Road.

Traffic volumes on the Northeastern Extension between the Mid-County and Lansdale Interchanges have increased from 47,000 vehicles per day to 67,000 vehicles per day over the past ten years. This portion of the Northeastern Extension has the highest traffic volume of any four-lane section of the statewide Turnpike System. Traffic volumes on this section are expected to increase to over 100,000 vehicles per day by the year 2030.

Happy New Year and Happy Spring. Now that we have survived this past winter, it is time to prepare for summer. Are you thinking about doing any new projects around your home? Please keep in mind that the Township and building code *require* permits for certain projects. It is in everyone's best interest to contact the Township before starting your project to verify if a permit is required. Nine times out of ten it is not the Township that discovers your project, it is your neighbor. Starting a project without the proper permits may result in extreme hardships through fines and even the removal of your project. A two minute phone call will save you hours of anxiety.

Did you know.....

Burning shall be permitted for recreational and entertainment purposes such as bon fires and campfires. Permission for such fires is required by the Township Codes Department at least 48 hours prior to the event. Contact The Director of Community Development, Bill Webb during normal business hours, Monday through Friday, 8:00 a.m. to 4:00 p.m. for approval. This is a FREE PERMIT.

ONE FINAL THOUGHT

If previous history has taught us anything our summer storms are just as dangerous as our winter storms. Here are some tips to keep you safe during a summer storm. When you see or hear the onset of a storm seek shelter. Always prepare for the worst. Keep a flash light handy and a stash of batteries on hand so that you will have some lighting in the event of a power outage. Purchase a battery operated radio so that you can stay informed. If you are using a generator never keep it indoors or in an attached garage. The CO2 will kill you. Never connect a generator directly into your home wiring. Hire a licensed electrician to install the proper cut-off switch.



Crime Prevention Tip

BEWARE OF SCAMS

Scams are on the rise in America, and Towamencin Township is no different. They come in all shapes and sizes, but the most common are either over the internet, telephone, or involving a contractor. The old saying that if "It is too good to be true, it probably isn't true" are words to keep your money by. If someone tells you that you have won a foreign lottery, ask yourself first, "Did I enter?" You cannot win a lottery you did not enter. In fact, if you entered a foreign lottery by phone or by mail, you likely may have violated a federal law. These scams ask you to send a processing or tax fee prior to them sending your winnings. No legitimate lottery will ask you to pay a fee in order to collect your prize.

Another popular scam involves a scammer calling you pretending to be a loved one or someone acting on behalf of a

loved one. They claim to be in jail, or that they are in need of medical care. To resolve their dilemma, they will request you to wire them money. Always call your loved one before wiring money anywhere. Contractor scams are on the rise as well, and normally involve someone showing up at your door unannounced and uninvited. In Towamencin Township, a permit is required for door-to-door sales. Ask to see a permit and always call the police if you are not comfortable. We are happy to speak with solicitors of all kinds. Please keep in mind that while all age groups are victimized, older Americans are most often targeted by scam artists. When in doubt about any situation, call the police.


TSC offers something for everyone.

In July 2013 the Morgan Log House was contacted by Aaron Bonsignore for completing a potential Eagle Scout project at Morgan Log House. After reviewing a number of potential projects, Aaron chose one which would take this 18th century structure into the 21st century.

The Morgan Log House property conpark land. Within these 1.7 acres there

are three (3) areas generally referred to as the upper field, lower field, and historic area. With limited staffing and hours of operation, any Visitors to the Museum during non-regular hours of operation unfortunately do not get the opportunity to learn about the property or its significance to Towamencin Township and Pennsylvania history. The installation of outdoor informational signage will help the Morgan Log House to further support its Mission to educate the public on the history of the property and the lives of its past residents. Outdoor signage will in essence enable the MLH to educate the public on a 24/7 basis. The signage provides Visitors with a glimpse into the past using his-

toric images, drawings and supporting text. In addition to using images and text, technology was also incorporated with the addition of "QR codes", allowing users of Smartphones and like devices to access additional information about the property. By incorporating Smartphone technology into the signs, we will be able to track Visitors by tracking usage of the QR codes, something that the site has never been able to do before. The signage project consisted of the installation of three (3) informational signs, one for each of the three (3) general areas. In addition, Aaron designed and constructed signs to mark the entrance to the 18th century kitchen garden and one to mark the public restroom to the rear of the property.






