



TOWAMENCIN TOWNSHIP FIRE MARSHAL'S OFFICE HOME FIRE SAFETY CHECKLIST

PLAN TO GET OUT ALIVE	YES	NO
 Does your family have a "Home Fire Escape Plan" with a pre-determined meeting place outside? 		
 Do you have a working smoke alarm of each floor of your home, test it weekly and replace the batteries twice a year? 		
 Do you have a Carbon Monoxide detector near the sleeping area of your home and do you test it weekly? 		
PLAN TO BE FIRE SAFE		
 Do you always make sure that matches and smoking materials are out before disposing of them? 		
 Have you made "Take Smoking Outside the home" a safety rule for your family? 		
 Do you read the warning labels on aerosol cans? Some propellants are highly flammable 		
• If you or a family member in your home uses oxygen, is that person forbidden from smoking in the same room as the oxygen?		
 Do you keep matches and lighters out of the reach of children? 		
 Do you keep burning candles away from children, pets and combustibles? 		
 Do you always extinguish candles before leaving the room? 		
ELECTRICAL HAZARDS		
 Are there enough electrical outlets in each room to avoid the need for multiple attachment plugs and long extension cords? 		
 Do you have dedicated circuits for high demand appliances such as air conditioners and dryers? 		
 Do you check the condition of extension cords and appliance cords for wear and damage? 		
 Do you avoid draping extension cords and wires over pipes and nails? 		
 Do you avoid running extension cords and appliance cords under carpeting or areas where they will be damaged? 		
HOUSEKEEPING HAZARDS		
 Is your address posted and visible from across the street? 		
 Do you keep your basement, closets & attic cleared of combustible materials? 		
 Do you keep paint, varnish & other metal containers tightly closed? 		
 Do you properly dispose of unwanted hazardous materials such as paints & varnish? 		
 Does everyone in your family know never to use gasoline or other flammable liquids for indoor cleaning? 		
 Do you always clear the snow away from the fire hydrant near your house? 		
HEATING AND COOKING HAZARDS		
 Do you always turn off portable heaters before going to bed? 		
 Do you always refill the fuel tank of a portable heater outside? 		
 Do you make sure that every portable heater is a safe distance from curtains, bedding and furniture? 		
 Are your kitchen stove, oven, broiler and microwave kept clean and free of grease? 		
 Are your curtains near kitchen ranges and heating equipment arranged to prevent them from blowing into the cooking area? 		
Do you make sure that you stay in the kitchen and watch what you are cooking?		
• Do you turn not handles inward from the edge of the stove to prevent injury?
