Resurfacing Operations Planned Next Week on Several State Highways Across Philadelphia Region

**King of Prussia, PA** – The Pennsylvania Department of Transportation (PennDOT) announced today that resurfacing operations will occur next week on several state highways in Philadelphia, Bucks, Chester, Delaware, and Montgomery counties under multiple ongoing projects to repair and resurface more than 200 miles of state highway across the five-county region.

Motorists are advised of the following travel restrictions:

## **Montgomery County**

- Monday, September 29, through Friday, October 31, from 6:00 PM to 6:00 AM the following morning, a weeknight lane closure with flagging will be in place on sections of Route 63
   (Main Street) between Valley Forge Road and Business U.S. 202 in Lansdale Borough, and Towamencin and Montgomery townships for paving.
- Monday, September 29, through Friday, October 31, from 6:00 PM to 6:00 AM the following morning, a weeknight lane closure with flagging will be in place on sections of <u>Doylestown</u> <u>Road (Business U.S. 202) between Route 463 (Cowpath Road) and County Line Road</u> in Montgomery Township for milling and paving.
- Monday, September 29, through Friday, October 31, from 6:00 PM to 6:00 AM the following morning, a weeknight lane closure with flagging will be in place on sections of <u>Evans Road</u> <u>between Plymouth Road and Route 63 (Welsh Road)</u> in Lower Gwynedd Township for milling and paving.

Drivers are advised to allow extra time when through the work areas because backups and delays will occur. All scheduled activities are weather dependent.

Under these resurfacing and improvement projects, PennDOT's contractors are repairing, milling, and repaving state highways with new asphalt pavement that will seal roadways and provide motorists with a safer and smoother riding surface.
