This year's contest was held during the first full week of May in honor of National Drinking Water Week, for students in grades kindergarten through fifth to design a fire hydrant. Cassidy, a fifth-grader at Nash Elementary at the time of the contest, submitted her design which was among almost 70 entries

received. A panel of judges from NPWA staff were selected to vote and deemed her the winner on Friday, May 8.
